

Fun Fly and participation awards to be given this year.

In an effort to boost participation in all SAC events the club will award event plaques in three different areas. Only SAC club members will qualify.

First, for the eight fun fly's there will be a first, second, and third place plaque awarded for the overall point winner based on the Red Bull Air Race point system as outlined below. Secondly, as an added incentive for participating in the fun fly events the club will give away an ARF airplane (exact model to be determined) at the December meeting and raffle. Each fun fly participant will be given a raffle ticket. The more you participate, the better your chance of winning. There is a total of eight fun fly events, including the Turkey Shoot, so the most possible number of raffle tickets a participant may collect is eight. At the December meeting, the winning raffle ticket will be drawn for the ARF.

Finally, there will be a "Modeler of the Year" plaque given for the club member who participates in the most events during the year, beginning in April and running through November. This includes attending monthly meetings, fun fly's, float fly's, war bird day, auctions, and the picnic. For this award the rules are simple, show up, register, and basically attend and you'll be marked down as participating. Whoever the club member is that has the most participation points at the end of the year will receive the honor of being deemed "Modeler of the Year". Should there be a tie in any category, then there will be co-winners and plaques given out accordingly. All plaques will be awarded at the annual banquet in March.

2019 Fun Fly point system.

The point system is based on the Red Bull air race series and will be as follows:

1 st	15 points
1	1
2^{nd}	12 points
3 rd	9 points
4^{th}	7 points

2019 January thru December Fun Fly Rules.

All SAC club members who fly at the Tinley Creek flying site may fly in the fun fly competitions and compete for points and prizes. Any size fixed wing aircraft may compete. Aircraft may be powered by nitro, gas, or electric. The following rules will be in effect for most of the fun fly events, however, the CD has full discretion to change the events for that day if he or she so chooses.

BOMB DROP

Use your own bomb and release design. You are scored where the bomb comes to rest within the target, on a line scores the higher points. Ribbons do not count. Center circle is 30 points, middle 20, and outer circle 10 points. Five points will be awarded for any bomb landing on the cut grass portion of the field.

TOUCH & GO'S

You have 1 minute to do 3 touch & go's all in same direction. The plane must lift off the ground for each touch & go to count. All takeoffs must start and end from the blacktop to count. Each touch & go scores 10 points.

PRECISION LANDING

Land in the bomb drop circles for the same points as a bomb drop. The first touch of your plane is where you are scored. On a line scores the higher point.

7-11

Ready your plane for flight. Clock starts when dice are thrown. When a 7 comes up take off. Continue throwing dice untill an 11 comes up and land is yelled. Clock stops at the first touchdown of your plane. 30 seconds or less 30 points, 31 to 50 seconds is 20 points, 51 to 70 seconds is 10 points, 71 to 90 seconds is 5 points, over 90 seconds scores 0 points.

If not lined up on the runway, you get 1 free pass for each of the first 3 tasks and 1 bomb reload for a bomb lost at takeoff.

An ARF will be awarded at the end of the fun fly season on a lucky draw basis. At the December meeting a number will be drawn, each fun flier will receive a number for each fun he competes in (8 counting the turkey shoot). You don't have to be at the December meeting to win. If bad weather prevents flying, the fun fly will be moved to the following Sunday. You can call AL at 219-663-6626 to verify a date change. Competition signups begin at 8:30 and flying begins at 9:00

Flying Field Rules Tinley Creek Model Airplane Flying Field

Updated March 2018

Tinley Creek Model Aircraft Flying Field (aka, SAC field) has three designated flying areas to accommodate all types of model aircraft including; fixed wing (airplanes), rotary (helicopters), and U-Control/multi-rotor (drones) aircraft. The designated areas are signed, as well as designated on the Field Safety Diagram. Pilots should use the area appropriate to their model type. Hybrid types (autogyros, V/STOL) should use the area appropriate to the intended flight pattern.

All pilots must abide by the current AMA Safety Code, FAA regulations, and CCFPD rules.

No spectators are allowed beyond the designated areas unless accompanied by an AMA member.

All participants and spectators must park in the designated parking areas.

No flying of any kind is allowed over the pits, parking area, entrance drive lane, or Cicero Avenue. A "No-Fly Zone" is designated on the Field Safety Diagram.

Pilots shall clearly call out "Take-Off"/ "Landing" or "On the Field" as appropriate to avoid possible conflicts. Pilots should minimize the time spent "on the field".

All pilots must fly behind the safety barrier (split rail fence) and be positioned in a designated pilot station at all times. When standing along the east/west fence the designated flight pattern shall be east/west. When flying from the north/south fence the designated flight pattern shall be north/south.

Pilots should not ground or air taxi their aircraft inside the safety barriers. Walk to the safety barrier and then taxi to the take-off area.

For safety, it's suggested that all pilots fly with a spotter. If flying FPV a spotter is required.

The first pilot(s) on the field in the morning should open the field/safety box. The last pilot(s) leaving in the evening should lock the field/safety box.

No helicopters or multi-rotor aircraft are to use the asphalt runway for any reason, <u>UNLESS (a) by</u> agreement with all other pilots currently using that area, or (b) no fixed wing pilots are present.

FLYING THE "L" - If a pilot chooses to fly in both east/west and north/south (Flying the "L") then he/she should stand in the corner of the pit fence and fly only from this location as shown on the Field Safety Diagram.

Flying the "L" should only be done when there are no helicopter pilots on the north/south flight line and it's communicated with everyone, airplane and helicopter pilots, that you are flying in both directions.

SAFETY LINE - Both Fixed wing (airplanes) and Rotary (Helicopters) are to respect the "Safety Line" as designated on the Field Safety Diagram and by orange cones or other means in the field. The "Safety Line" is an imaginary line extended east / west from the asphalt path south of the airplane pit area. At



no time should aircraft cross this line without the pilots communicating their intentions to others at the field and mutual agreement that it's acceptable to cross this line.

High speed low passes should be not be made closer to the pit area than the center line of the active runway or take-off area for that aircraft type.

In the event that Free Flight model pilots are using the field, they may use the north south grass runway area and west open space to fly as long as there is no conflict with other radio controlled airplanes or helicopters <u>AND</u> they communicate their intentions to others at the field and mutually agree on what is acceptable to all parties.

The Contest or Event Director of an AMA sanctioned event or FPDCC permitted event may make adjustments to these rules if necessary for the safety of participants and spectators.

Courtesy items.

Extensive ground testing and run-up of nitro or gas engines should be performed as far away from other people as possible.

Avoid directing prop blast at people or other models

END OF RULES

Motion to amend the SAC Bylaws.

The following motion has been made to amend Article 13 of the Bylaws to add the following words to both Section 1 and Section 2:

"The dues for new members joining after June 30 in any year shall be at the rate of \$5.00 per month for the remaining months or part months in the year."

The rationale for this is that the part year membership rate has not been changed when we have changed the annual dues, and is now out of line with the annual rate. This corrects the anomaly.

In accordance with *Article 18* of the SAC Bylaws, this is notice that the vote to approve this change will be held at the April 2019 meeting.
